## SCIO Donor Bill of Rights

Spinal Cord Injury Ontario respects your privacy. We protect your personal information and adhere to all legislative requirements with respect to privacy. We <u>do not</u> rent or sell our mailing lists. We use your personal information to keep you informed and up-to-date on the activities of Spinal Cord Injury Ontario, including newsletters, program updates and special events.

As a donor of Spinal Cord Injury Ontario your rights and our responsibilities to you are in accordance with those endorsed by the Association of Fundraising Professionals (AFP) and Imagine Canada. Your rights are:

- > To be informed of Spinal Cord Injury Ontario's mission, of the way Spinal Cord Injury Ontario intends to use donated resources, and of its capacity to use donations effectively for their intended purposes.
- > To receive appropriate acknowledgement and recognition.
- ➤ To be informed of the identity of those serving on Spinal Cord Injury Ontario's governing board, and to expect the board to exercise prudent judgment in its stewardship responsibilities.
- > To have access to Spinal Cord Injury Ontario's most recent financial statements.
- > To be assured that information about their donations is handled with respect and with confidentiality to the extent provided by law.
- > To be assured their gifts will be used for the purposes for which they were given. To expect that all relationships with individuals representing Spinal Cord Injury Ontario will be professional in nature.
- > To be informed whether those seeking donations are volunteers, employees of Spinal Cord Injury Ontario or hired solicitors.
- > To have the opportunity for their names to be deleted from mailing lists that Spinal Cord Injury Ontario may intend to share.
- > To feel free to ask questions when making a donation and to receive prompt, truthful and forthright answers.
